Cancer Centre Sexual Health Clinic

Support for patients with changes related to sexuality, intimacy and body image.





What is the Cancer Centre Sexual Health Clinic?

The Cancer Centre Sexual Health Clinic is for patients who are experiencing sexual concerns as a result of their cancer treatment. Common changes include:

- Body image concerns
- Low sexual desire
- Difficulties with erections
- Vaginal changes
- Pain during sexual activity
- Orgasm changes
- Relationship adjustment and communication

The aim of the clinic is to look at these changes and develop a plan with you to respond to them.

Your partner is encouraged to come to the clinic with you but you are welcome to come on your own.

The clinic offers confidential, non-judgmental, and queer- and trans-friendly services.

Who are the team members?

Specialized nursing staff will work with you to address your concerns and coordinate your care. Nurses will provide information, counselling, and support. Other health care team members may be involved in your care as needed.

How do I get an appointment?

Ask one of your health care providers (nurse, doctor, social worker) to make a referral.

Where is the clinic?

The clinic is in the Cancer Centre at Kingston General Hospital. Please go to Burr 0 Reception and you will be directed to our clinic.
